JAPAN

It was announced at 2100 hrs yesterday that Russia would consider herself at War with Japan as from midnight last night. In the early hours of this morning the Red Army crossed the frontier of Manchukuo whilst Red Airforce planes bombed targets behind the Japanese Lines. The news came to Japan whilst the Jap Cabinet was in session to examine the effects of the Atomic Bomb.

More information is revealed today of the Atomic Bomb which was dropped on Tuesday on the naval base of Hiroshima. Observers reporthat in the centre of the area where the bomb struck there is "nothing left to cast a shadow" - complete disintegration has been effected. In the shattered outskirts of the city fires are still burning fiercely among the debris.
