Far East

The first American troops have landed in Japan. 150 technical specialists landed yesterday at an airport 80 miles from Tokio. 300 planes a day will be landing in the future.

The Allied Fleet is anchored off the Japanese coast in a line 100 miles long. Part of the US Fleet sailed into Tokio Bay this morning.

A local agreement has been signed in Burma with the Japanese leaders. A British task force has entered the Malacca Straits and is on its way to the port of Penang.

2 United States aircraft landed at Shanghai this morning. The Chinese Army occupied Shanghai last night.

Civilian economic groups to guard rubber, tin and palm-oil in Malaya are ready to move in.

United States

The worst hurricane in 25 years is sweeping across the Gulf Coast of Texas.

Greece

Anti-Allied pamphlets are being circulated in Athens.

Home

A Government report on the Northumberland and Durham coal fields states that there are ample reserves for another hundred years. The report advocates better underground transport facilities.
